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the metamorphosis is a novella written by franz kafka which was first published in 1915
one of kafka s best known works the metamorphosis tells the story of salesman gregor
samsa who wakes one morning to find himself inexplicably transformed into a huge
insect german ungeheures ungeziefer literally monstrous vermin subsequently
struggling to adjust to this new condition the novella has been widely discussed among
literary critics with differing interpretations being offered franz kafka 3 july 1883 3 june
1924 a german speaking bohemian novelist and short story writer widely regarded as

one of the major figures of 20th century literature his work fuses elements of realism and the fantastic it typically features isolated protagonists facing bizarre or surrealistic predicaments and incomprehensible socio bureaucratic powers it has been interpreted as exploring themes of alienation existential anxiety guilt and absurdity his best known works include *die verwandlung* the metamorphosis *der process* the trial and *das schloss* the castle the term kafkaesque has entered the english language to describe situations like those found in his writing kafka was born into a middle class german jewish family in prague the capital of the kingdom of bohemia then part of the austro hungarian empire today the capital of the czech republic he trained as a lawyer and after completing his legal education was employed full time by an insurance company forcing him to relegate writing to his spare time over the course of his life kafka wrote hundreds of letters to family and close friends including his father with whom he had a strained and formal relationship he became engaged to several women but never married he died in 1924 at the age of 40 from tuberculosis few of kafka s works were published during his lifetime the story collections *betrachtung* contemplation and *ein landarzt* a country doctor and individual stories such as *die verwandlung* were published in literary magazines but received little public attention in his will kafka instructed his executor and friend max brod to destroy his unfinished works including his novels *der prozess* *das schloss* and *der verschollene* translated as both *amerika* and *the man who disappeared* but brod ignored these instructions his work has influenced a vast range of writers critics artists and philosophers during the 20th and 21st centuries translated by ian johnston

as gregor samsa awoke one morning from uneasy dreams he found himself transformed in his bed into a gigantic insect he was laying on his hard as it were armor plated back and when he lifted his head a little he could see his domelike brown belly divided into stiff arched segments on top of which the bed quilt could hardly keep in position and was about to slide off completely his numerous legs which were pitifully thin compared to the rest of his bulk waved helplessly before his eyes with it s startling bizarre yet surprisingly funny first opening kafka begins his masterpiece the metamorphosis it is the story of a young man who transformed overnight into a giant beetle like insect becomes an object of disgrace to his family an outsider in his own home a quintessentially alienated man a harrowing though absurdly comic meditation on human feelings of inadequacy guilt and isolation the metamorphosis has taken its place as one of the most widely read and influential works of twentieth century fiction as w h auden wrote kafka is important to us because his predicament is the predicament of

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from one of the greatest writers of the twentieth century the author of the metamorphosis and the trial a collection that brings together the stories he allowed to be published during his lifetime including his best known tale of a man who wakes up transformed into an insect to max brod his literary executor kafka wrote of all my writings the only books that can stand are these kafka s survey of the insectile situation of young jews in inner bohemia can hardly be improved upon with their posterior legs they were still glued to their father s jewishness and with their wavering anterior legs they found no new ground there is a sense in which kafka s jewish question what have i in common with jews has become everybody s question jewish alienation the template for all our doubts what is muslimness what is femaleness what is polishness these days we all find our anterior legs flailing before us we re all insects all ungeziefer now zadie smith bestselling author of white teeth and on beauty
